## EU Network of Excellence CINEFOGO 2005 – 2009

Edited by Thomas Boje and Lars Josephsen

### Introduction

The Network of Excellence **CINEFOGO – Civil Society and New Forms of Governance in Europe – the Making of European Citizenship** aimed at enhancing the understanding of social and democratic participation in Europe. The CINEFOGO Network was concerned with the importance of improving citizens' active participation in governance at local, national, regional and European levels. Through its scientific activities – joint research and dissemination of scientific results - the CINEFOGO Network created new knowledge on the role of cultural diversity, active citizenship and formation of organized civil society in Europe.

The CINEFOGO Network ran for more than 4 years from 1st of September 2005 to 30th of November 2009. Within an organizational framework with Roskilde University as the leading contractor of the Network, and professor Thomas P. Boje as the international coordinator, a large number of individual researchers (about two hundreds) from 45 universities, research institutions, and other organizations placed in 16 European countries have constituted the CINEFOGO Network, and have contributed to the work. A list of the involved institutions can be found in Annex I. – The CINEFOGO Network was financed under the European Commission's Framework Programme 6 (FP6).

This account informs briefly about the main activities, which took place under the heading of the Network of Excellence CINEFOGO: First, an overview is presented of the scientific goals of the CINEFOGO Network and how the Network activities were clustered around three thematic areas. Then follows a short mention of the publications produced by the Network, and of the work packages (WPs) within which all the scientific activities have been organized, and finally a brief outline is given of the activities addressing the dissemination of the scientific results.

## 1. Scientific Goals and Thematic Areas

In order to accomplish its mission, CINEFOGO set up two equally important programmes: A **Programme for Integrating Research Activities** (PIRA) and a programme for **Spread of Excellence** (SOE). The first programme (PIRA) was dedicated to the enhancement of integrating research activities and jointly executed research in the Network through conferences, workshops and seminars; whereas the second programme (SOE) was inspired by the vision of an ongoing dialogue nourished by social scientists and affiliated partners from the public sphere and organized civil society.

## Three major goals

The activities of the CINEFOGO Network have been aiming at three major goals. Under close surveillance from the international coordination team, the goals have been taken into account during the entire project period. The goals were:

### Minimizing barriers for joint European integrated and coordinated research.

With participation of outstanding scholars and institutions from more than 40 European universities and research institutions the CINEFOGO Network has build up a strong cooperative organization for research and scientific communication on the themes citizenship, active participation, governance and organized civil society. Scientific institutions and scholars involved in the CINEFOGO Network represent several major research institutions in the 'old' EU Member States, which together with universities and research institutions in the 'new' EU Member States have created a strong and lively network especially for young scholars.

### Involvement of previous EU-research in the field of 'Governance and Citizenship'

The CINEFOGO Network has established a dialogue between on-going and ended so-called TSER<sup>1</sup> projects (EU financed) in the research area of 'Civil Society, Citizenship and Governance'. During the last years contact had been taken with several of the European Research Network in question, and cooperation had been established<sup>2</sup>.

### Providing institutional capacity for a continued dialogue

between researchers, policy makers, public service institutions and organized civil society on the political future of the European Union, especially with respect to promotion of citizens' involvement and participation in policy making. This goal has been pursued particularly through CINEFOGO's programme for dissemination of scientific results (SOE), the OUTCOME database and a monthly e-letter with news from the CINEFOGO Network. Furthermore, two final conferences<sup>3</sup>, arranged in Brussels in close cooperation with representatives from the EU-Commission and from the European civil society organizations, also served this purpose.

## Three thematic areas

The scientific activities of the CINEFOGO Network have been organized around three themes and each of these themes was supervised by a theme coordinator in cooperation with the international coordinator. At Network Council meetings the activities taking place under each theme were carefully evaluated and it was discussed how to proceed. A brief introduction to the content of the three thematic areas is presented below.<sup>4</sup>

## Thematic Area 1: Identities, Values and Civic Cultures in Europe – Integration and Diversity

The first theme area “Identities, Values and Civic Cultures in Europe – Integration and Diversity” aimed at improving the understanding of European citizenship and citizens’ participation in civil society. The new conception of citizenship does not envisage it as a passive conferring of social rights and responsibilities but as their active appropriation by the groups previously excluded from them. In the CINEFOGO Network the conceptualization of citizenship is linked to peoples’ willingness and ability to actively participate in society and is performed when citizens take responsibility in their relations to a wide range of private and public institutions.

Active citizenship is the arena where rights and responsibilities are defined, claimed and defended. Particularly for young people, practicing active citizenship means also identity formation, developing a set of civic values and sense of belonging to a democratic polity. Citizenship also requires subjective definition of the polity people identify with – the locality, the region, the continent, and the world. Issues like mass emigration, double citizenship, rise of nationalism, and ethnic conflicts have all questioned the previous straightforward understanding of state citizenship.

## Thematic Area 2: Citizenship and Civic Participation in Relation to Social Protection

The thematic area 2 of CINEFOGO dealt with “Citizenship and Civic Participation in Relation to Social Protection”. It therefore created links from the three broad items – the one of civil society, the one of new forms of governance and the one of citizenship - to welfare issues related to national contexts as well as to the level of the European Union.

The CINEFOGO Network underlined three items to be taken care of specifically

- *forms of organized welfare*, e.g. in terms of service-provision *outside state institutions*
- *forms of citizens’ participation*. Along-side with social policies and welfare services participative mechanisms and additional forums for negotiation have been created, partly substituting, partly *complementing representative political decision-making*;
- a broader view on citizens’ participation, going beyond the political aspect of participation, i.e. the civil society as a public sphere, by concerning various forms of volunteering

The basic idea of participation coincides with the move from a government model towards a governance model. In this new model, a decentralization process is promoted – especially in highly centralized states - and innovative forms of horizontal collaboration between state actors and civil society replace strong state power, and networks emerge as an increasingly significant mode of coordination.

## Thematic Area 3: Multi-Level Governance and Organized Civil Society

Within theme area 3 “Multi-level governance and organized civil society”, CINEFOGO activities have been concerned with relations between non-state actors belonging to civil society and political institutions and actors involved in decision-making activities at different territorial levels. An issue of particular interest has been the transition from government to governance and the related dispersion of political authority across territorial levels.

matic area 3). A more comprehensive exposé of reflections on the three thematic areas can be found in the CINEFOGO outcomes database.

In our work governance was a contested concept; broadly described as “governing without a government. The notion of dispersion identifies the considered dynamics. It means that collective decisions can be made by a larger number of actors than previously, and can take place outside political institutions and in different sites. Clearly, the concept is particularly relevant for its implications for the European Union and its development as a multi-level system, where nation-states are no longer the only decisive actors in the political arena.

In this light, it has been observed that Europeanization, understood as the impact of the process of European integration on polities, policies and politics, represents a powerful source of transformation of established governmental arrangements and dynamics towards new forms of governance. The process of Europeanization and its impact on social and institutional actors has been a central research interest for CINEFOGO programme.

## 2. Publications and Work Packages

This section gives a short mention of the publications emanating from the CINEFOGO Network, and of the work packages (WPs) within which all the scientific activities have been organized. A list of all 50 work packages developed and implemented during the CINEFOGO Network project period is found in Annex II.

### Publications

The documentation of the research work that has been carried out by partners in the CINEFOGO Network over 4 years, and has involved up to two hundreds of researchers and scholars is – in accordance with its nature - comprehensive. The entire material encompasses a large number of papers, articles, memos, and newsletters, all available in the *CINEFOGO Outcomes Database*. Publications make up the major part of the documentation, and they are generally accessible to interested outside researchers, to policy makers from public and private research institutions, to media and to the general public (cf. <http://cinefogo.cuni.cz>).

Result presenting **publications** are collected in 5 CINEFOGO *working paper series* containing in total more than 200 papers. The series are characterized by the following key words:

- I. Organized civil society, multi-level governance, public-private partnership and state-civil society relation (this series includes 61 publications)
- II. Social rights, social protection, social cohesion, citizen rights and social services (this series includes 47 publications)
- III. Social capital, active participation, trust, social network, voluntary work (this series includes 62 publications)
- IV. National identity, multi-culturalism, non-European citizens, marginalization (this series includes 20 publications)
- V. Gender, work-care-family relations, citizenship (this series includes 14 publications)

Further, some **scientific articles** are to be found in

- journal articles or special issues of journals (as e.g. *European Societies, European Sociological Review, Journal of European Social Policy, Perspectives on European Politics and Society, Voluntas, Social Politics, and Journal of Civil Society*)
- edited books (published by *Edward Elgar Publisher, Nomos Publisher* in a European Civil Society Series, *Oxford University Press, and Routledge*).

Scientific articles are also distributed via the **ICConnectEU** website ([www.iconnect.eu](http://www.iconnect.eu)), a pilot internet portal, created as a joint platform for dissemination of outcomes from CINEFOGO and eight other similar (EU-funded) projects (such as e.g. CONNEX, NEWGOV), all dealing with different aspects of *EU governance*. This arrangement will allow users of such information more easily to get an overview of actors, activities and outcomes related to EU governance as a research topic, and to see how a given project's research and outcomes are related to each others.

At the EU level selected CINEFOGO publications are announced through press releases via CORDIS in order to reach interested policy makers ([www.cordis.europa.eu](http://www.cordis.europa.eu)). - CORDIS, the Community Research and Development Information Service for Science, Research and Development, is the official source of information on the seventh framework programme (FP7) calls for proposals; it offers interactive web facilities that links together researchers, policymakers, managers and key players in the field of research. CORDIS is managed by the Publications Office.

## Work Packages

When it comes to the organization of the concrete work in relation to a specified issue and the contributions of the actual partners within the Network, the *work package* has – as a process tool - been the pivotal point. The scope of work, the selected aspects, time frames, size of work load attached to actual CINEFOGO partners and specific researchers, internal meetings and public seminars, - all these components were defined in relation to each work package. And every work package proposal had to be evaluated and approved by the Network Council in order to ensure quality and consistency.

As previously mentioned, all 50 work packages are listed in Annex II. One may wonder how such a great number of work packages can be set up and handled in a way that is consistent with the focus of the entire CINEFOGO project, including the declared project objectives. Here the three theme areas (cf. above) enter into the picture. These themes were delimited already in the basic project document, i.e. before individual WP's were thought out, and they have to some extent acted as 'attractors' and thereby setting frames for definition of the content of the individual WPs. During the first and second project year between 20 and 30 WPs were gradually established and/or on the move. The issues and their relations to the thematic areas are illustrated below:

Thematic Area 1 'Identities, Values and Civic Cultures in Europe – Integration and Diversity' was in the first round 'filled in' by addressing the following issues:

- Civic cultures and representation of European citizenship in the mass media (WP7)
- National identity and its relation to citizenship (WP8)

- E-learning as a strategy for combating civil apathy and exclusion (WP9)
- Human Rights and social citizenship of non-EU citizens (WP10)

#### Thematic Area 2 'Citizenship and Civic Participation in Relation to Social Protection':

- Differences in social participation and civic cultures across Europe (WP11)
- Gender, social citizenship and participation (WP12)
- Changing forms of state intervention in social protection – their effects on social citizenship rights (WP13)
- Citizens' participation in policy making (WP14)
- Civic elements in the governance and production of social services (WP15)

#### Thematic Area 3 'Multi-Level Governance and Organized Civil Society'

- Volunteering – civic participation and social inclusion (WP16)
- Partnership – keystone of governance (WP17)
- Social capital and governance: A comparison between Europe and USA (WP18)
- Political ideologies and third sector (WP19)
- Social movements and civil society (WP20)

Ideas on relevant issues that emerged later in the project period, were transformed into new work package proposals, and they were evaluated as described above. In this way the CINEFOGO ended up with 50 WPs. The budget frame, not ideas was the limiting factor.

## 3. Activities Addressing Dissemination of Scientific Results

The second programme within the CINEFOGO project was named 'Spread of Excellence', (SOE). This part was inspired by the vision of an ongoing dialogue nourished by social scientists and affiliated partners from the public sphere and organized civil society. Thus several work packages were centered on stakeholder involvement, whereas other activities were instrumental in the sense that they provided platforms to facilitate the dialogue between scholars, civil society organizations and the public in general.

### Stakeholder involvement

A series of initiatives aiming at involving stakeholders were accomplished. They included E-learning course, Student corner, Expert meeting on work-life issues, EU Aid Policy, EPICS Programme, Learning between South and North, and the First Final Conference.

#### E-learning course (WP09)

This work package included among other activities an e-learning course called 'E-citizen-ship', implemented at Vytautas Magnus University (Lithuania). It is a *service-learning* course, which involves contacts and experience with the "real world", experts in the field, people engaged in the activity. In practice it means that students of the course spend 40 hours for learning "the-

ory” and 100 hours in organizations of civil society for “learning by doing”. The course was involved in the graduate programme entitled “Applied Sociology” at the Department of Sociology at the University and will be offered to national and international graduate students.

### Student Corner (WP22)

The Student Corner is a website made for making information about civil society and third sector research easily available on the web for students. The website was presented at a conference on Contemporary European Perspectives on Volunteering in September 2008 and at the 9th Annual PhD Network Meeting in Leuven in May 2009. Doctoral participants were also instructed to upload their working papers to the Senior CATS section of the site. Student Corner also appeared in the newsletter ‘Inside ISTR’<sup>5</sup>. Around 100 leaders from civil society and third sector courses across Europe have been contacted with information about the benefits of the site.

### Work-life Issues (WP24)

An expert meeting was held in Plovdiv (Bulgaria) which gathered 14 high-level policy makers from several Bulgarian public institutions engaged in labour and social policy, employment, social assistance, and child protection. Also members of national civil society organizations such as the Chamber of Commerce and Industry, the Business Chamber, the Agency for Regional Development and the Green Balkans participated. On the agenda were work-life issues and probable trends in the life of working parents and possible scenarios for the ten-year period in Bulgaria.

### EU aid Policy, Civil Society, North and South (WP37)

This work package included a conference on “Civil and Uncivil Society in the 21st Century”. The event attracted an international set of speakers and audience. 21 papers were presented by speakers from countries as diverse as Turkey, Lebanon, Iran, Bangladesh and South Africa and on a broad variety of themes such as EU strategy for civil society funding, diasporas and development, civil society and migrant organizations, and conceptual and theoretical issues around civil and uncivil society.

### Civil Society Leadership (WP40)

The EPICS (European Programme in Civil Society) programme is a trans-European educational programme for top level executives from European civil society organizations (CSOs). The overall aim was to support the creation of a European identity and an international strategic awareness among decision makers with a background in different CSOs and various civil society contexts. 18 CSO leaders from Sweden, Switzerland, Austria, Ireland, and Romania participated. The participation of CSO leaders from Central and Eastern Europe (EEC), fostered through scholarships, inflicted a valuable EEC-perspective to the programme.

### Learning between North and South (WP43)

A workshop took place 27-28 October 2008 aiming at bringing together practitioners from across the world to share and discuss experiences on citizen participation. Priority was given to CINEFOGO, DRC and NGPA members and a number of non-CINEFOGO members who had attended other CINEFOGO events. The participant list was impressive in coverage and diversity, with presenters from 18 different countries ranging from Brazil to Bangladesh, Finland to

South Africa. The Institute of Development Studies (IDS) at the University of Sussex was brought in, in order to include its network of researchers from the global South. The director of the Development Research Centre for Citizenship, Participation and Accountability, collaborated with us.

### First final conference (WP44)

The first final conference on “Social rights, active citizenship and governance in the European Union” took place Brussels, March 17-18, 2009. About 75 of the attendants were representatives of EU-level NGOs, members of EC and EP, researchers outside the network and journalists, and about 50 participants came from the CINEFOGO Network. Mr. Vladimír Špidla, the then EC Commissioner for Employment, Social Affairs and Equal Opportunities, opened the plenary session. At the conference CINEFOGO presented findings on the relationships among citizens, NGOs, civil servants and politicians at the European and national levels which created an ideal platform for productive discussions between European researchers, EP members, EU officials, NGO representatives, and the media.

## Dialogue Platforms

As mentioned above, an important goal of the SOE part of CINEFOGO programme was to support **dialogues** between researchers, policy makers, public service institutions and organized civil society on the political future of the European Union, especially with respect to promotion of citizens’ involvement and participation in policy making. Apart from the activities focusing directly on specific stakeholders (as outlined above), the goal was also pursued through the establishment of various information and communication platforms including the Outcomes database, CINEFOGO media corner, monthly e-letters with news from the CINEFOGO Network, policy briefs from (most of) the work packages, and a series of Newsletters published via the CINEFOGO website. These platforms are sketched below.

### Outcomes Database

The CINEFOGO database has throughout the project period been continuously developed and updated. The database has an incorporated catalogue for consultation with entrances by subject, author, title and topic. This makes the database user-friendly and it acts as a primarily dissemination tool for publications from the CINEFOGO network. In the last project year, there has been a monthly average in the database of about 230.000 visits.

### CINEFOGO Media Corner

CINEFOGO offers a rich source of documents on civil society, governance, citizenship, welfare, social protection, gender, cultural identities, civic participation and other topics related to changing forms of citizenship in the processes of European integration and globalization. However, many documents within CINEFOGO are academic texts written by re-searchers who all share a highly specialized background. Consequently, these texts often expect the readers to already understand some of the fundamental knowledge of the field, scientific methods and concepts as well as the jargon and language.

The Media Corner is about to solve this issue. Here research results are matched against ongoing public debate and policy developments by making press releases and policy briefs targeted at policy-makers - mainly politicians, public administration, NGOs, journalists, and general public – and citizens interested in democracy and social developments. All press releases are available at the Media Corner and are distributed to Magazines and Web-sites, related to CINEFOGO topics. (cf. [www.cinefogo.org/media](http://www.cinefogo.org/media)).

### Monthly e-letters

The CINEFOGO Network encompasses about 50 universities and other knowledge institutions, and about two hundreds of individual scholars are involved in producing reports and publications and other material. Core activities of the Network itself concern the planning and implementation of a large number of workshops, seminars, conferences, etc. Against this background it is not surprising that the Network management experienced an increasing demand from all involved parties for access to a frequently updated information system. A usual Newsletter issued e.g. a couple of times a year does not react fast enough in order to satisfy such a demand. Therefore the CINEFOGO e-letter was developed. In the project period it announced brief information on upcoming events and other Network relevant news, and it was a useful instrument for information spreading.

### Policy briefs

A means to urge social scientist and other scholars in the CINEFOGO Network to make their research results available to policy makers and the public in general, has been to let the WP responsible persons write “policy briefs” in which they in short form highlight some perspectives associated with the achievements of the actual work related to that particular work package. During the summer 2009 such policy briefs were available in relation to many work packages. However, not all WP responsables have been able to deliver a policy brief, but have instead written sections on policy implications. The policy briefs as well as the policy implications are included in the CINEFOGO Outcomes data bases. Some of the WP responsible researchers have included their messages targeted to policy makers in publications and journals. Policy briefs have - in some cases - been further elaborated into press releases, which were distributed through the CINEFOGO media corner and Cordis Wire.

### Newsletters

A primary function of CINEFOGO Newsletters was throughout the project period to stimulate dialogue and debate on broader themes related to the core issues addressed by the CINEFOGO Network. This aim was pursued by urging outstanding scholars within or outside Network partners or policy makers to express their views on such themes in form of brief essays presented in the Newsletter (cf. [www.cinefogo.org/publications/newsletters](http://www.cinefogo.org/publications/newsletters)).

Examples on such contributions are

## Concluding Remarks

From the beginning of the CINEFOGO Network the CINEFOGO partners considered ways to ensure sustainability, i.e. some sort of continuation of the CINEFOGO work and/or attempts for the further stabilization of the Network. And some elements in this respect are outlined below.

### CIPACI, Denmark

The Centre for Citizenship, Democratic Participation and Civil Society (CIPACI) has during the 2009 established a platform and structure at Roskilde University, Department of Society and Globalization. Several researchers in the department have been active for establishing the centre. In the third period the centre had a lecture series with international guest lecturers. The centre has arranged a lecture series for the year 2009-10 and will arrange conferences, seminar and workshops for both international researchers and PhD students. (cf. WP16)

### E-learning at Vytautas Magnus University, Lithuania

After the successful pilot of attempt in September 2008, a course named E-learning was involved in the graduate programme entitled “Applied Sociology” at the Department of Sociology and will be offered to national and international graduate students at Vytautas Magnus University in spring semester each year. (WP9)

### European Civil Society Alumni Network

Closely linked to the European PhD Dissertation Network is the Civil Society PhD Alumna Network that aims at building a sustainable community of young European PhDs working in the field of civil society. The aim of the Alumna Network is to maintain and strengthen the professional and social bonds within the network that the PhD Dissertation network has created and also to function as a pool of junior facilitators and lecturers for the next generation of PhD Dissertation Network meetings (cf. WP21)

### Student corner

The development of the student corner has diminished due to the fact that there is no more funding, but the website team are focusing on keeping the website up and running for as long as possible (cf. WP22)

All publications and results from the CINEFOGO Network were carried by excellent researchers who through four years of collaboration have inspired and learned from each other. Although the activities of the CINEFOGO Network are officially ended, strong networks and individual relations between more than 200 North-South-East-West European scholars and researchers have been established and will without any doubt award more research collaboration on governance and citizenship in the future. Several groups have moreover been organised for new FP7 proposals.

CINEFOGO has through its work packages and many research and dissemination activities established a solid platform for improving dialogue and integrated research on new forms of governance and citizenship in the European Union.
